## Comcast Public Meeting on June 1<sup>st</sup>

Bowling Green, Virginia—

Comcast will be meeting the public and answering question about their expanding service in Caroline County on Wednesday, June 1 at the County Visitor Center from 5:00 PM to 7:30 PM.

Public interest has been strong to discover the scope and extent of Comcast's service plans since the company first announced its intention to bring high speed internet and other services to Caroline's west side residential communities. County officials invited Comcast to meet with the public to answer questions that Caroline residents might have.

Comcast has expressed at various times that it may offer a variety of services to Caroline residents. County officials are providing a venue for Comcast to be able to begin to further define what those services and their cost might be to residents.

Information from the meeting will be collected to report to County citizens at a later date for those unable to attend. All persons with an interest in the new internet services, however, are being urged to attend in person to have their questions fully answered by the utility provider.

The Comcast meeting is a result of past County and citizen work to jointly appeal to the internet provider to service Caroline County. Since the announcement of the intention to serve Caroline, one Comcast official has said that the company has received numerous calls for information—perhaps more than from any other community where service has been announced.

The Caroline County Visitor Center is located less than a mile from the Interstate 95, 104 Interchange on Rt. 207, east toward Bowling Green.
