**Summary:** Attached is a memorandum from Fire-EMS Chief Jason Loftus seeking authorization to apply for a Virginia Office of EMS Rescue Squad Assistance Fund grant in the amount of \$11,122.40. If awarded, grant funds will be used to purchase an adult Airway Manikin Trainer, an Infant Airway Manikin Trainer, a moulage kit, three Simulaids for Medical QuikClot and four AED's.

**Budget Impact:** A 50% local match of \$5,561.20 is required. The proposed source of funds for the local match is the Fire-Rescue Reserve.

**Action(s) Requested of Board of Supervisors:** Authorize Chief Loftus to apply for a Virginia Office of EMS Rescue Squad Assistance Fund grant in the amount of \$11,122.40 and to utilize the Fire-Rescue Reserve for the required \$5,561.20 local match

Subject: RSAF Grant request: EMS Training Equipment

The Virginia Office of EMS, designates grant funds for continued EMS operations in localities. The Rescue Squad Assistance Fund (RSAF) allows for the purchase of equipment directly related to the provision of medical care.

The Department is seeking purchase several pieces of EMS training equipment to support the Department expanded role and training into Active Shooter Hostile Events(ASHE). Items include; (1) adult Airway Manikin Trainer, (1) Infant Airway Manikin Trainer, (1) moulage Kit (3) Simulaids for Medical QuikClot, (4) AED's.

The Department is requesting permission to apply for a 50/50 grant to replace the above-mentioned equipment with a total cost of \$11,122.40 with a local obligation of \$5,561.20. Funds for the local obligation are recommended to come from the Fire-Rescue Reserve.
