Summary: The following appointments are pending for the September 22 Board of Supervisors meeting:

Board of Equalization

As discussed at the August 11, 2020 Board of Supervisors meeting, the appointment of a Board of Equalization (BOE) is needed in conjunction with the ongoing general reassessment of real estate in Caroline County. An expeditious appointment of the BOE is requested to keep completion of the reassessment on schedule.

Appointments to the BOE are needed from the Bowling Green, Madison and Western Caroline districts.

Planning Commission (Western Caroline)

The term of Gary Dudley as the Western Caroline District representative to the Planning Commission will expire on October 31, 2020.

Bay Consortium Workforce Development Board of Directors

Staff has received a request from Jackie Davis, Executive Director of Virginia Career Works Bay Consortium Region, to appoint Economic Development Director Gary Wilson as Caroline County's representative to the Bay Consortium Workforce Development Board.

The Bay Consortium Workforce Development Board was formed by sixteen jurisdictions (Accomack, Caroline, Essex, Fredericksburg City, King George, King & Queen, King William, Lancaster, Mathews, Middlesex, Northampton, Northumberland, Richmond,

Spotsylvania, Stafford, and Westmoreland) under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and administers the federally funded employment & training programs which serve adults and youth from low income families (economically disadvantaged) and other eligible workers who have lost their jobs. The Workforce Development Area supports public/private partnerships involving local government, business and industry, labor, education and training institutions, employment services, and community support organizations.

Members of the Workforce Development Board are appointed by local elected officials to guide and oversee employment and training programs. Membership includes representation from business, education, organized labor, rehabilitation services, community-based organizations, economic development and public employment services.
