**Summary:** The following appointments are pending for the May 24 Board of Supervisors meeting:

**Middle Peninsula Juvenile Detention Commission**

The appointment of Deputy County Administrator Alan Partin as the County's representative to the Middle Peninsula Juvenile Detention Commission (MPJDC) will expire on June 30, 2022.

The MPJDC operates the Merrimac Juvenile Detention Center, which serves both the 9th and 15th District Court Service Units for a total of 18 localities, which includes Caroline County.

**Rappahannock Area Community Services Board**

The term of Melissa White as one of Caroline's three (3) representatives to the Rappahannock Area Community Services Board will expire on June 30, 2022.

**Rappahannock Emergency Medical Services Council**

The appointment of Deputy Fire-EMS Chief Mark Garnett as the County's career representative to the Rappahannock Emergency Medical Services (REMS) Council will expire on June 30, 2022.

The REMS Council facilitates the development and continued operation of a high quality, dedicated and coordinated emergency response and preparedness system for the Planning Districts 9 & 16.

**Social Services Board**

The term of Mavis Lewis, Reedy Church representative to the Social Services Board, will expire on June 30, 2022. This appointment may be deferred in the event the Board of Supervisors decides to convert the Social Services Board from an administrative board to an advisory board.
